MINUTES

1. **Apologies:** Mr S Harrod (District Councillor).

2. **Declarations of interest:** Albury Lane (Mrs Draper) and Hedges on London Road, Milton Common (Mrs Horne).

3. **Approval of previously circulated minutes:**

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held 3 February 2014 were approved and signed with one small amendment.

4. **Matters arising from previous minutes:**

a. Pelican crossing in village – Clerk has asked Oxfordshire County Council to carry out viability survey.

b. Drainage works in village:

Ickford Road – Drainage problems caused by surface water on road not flowing into ditch by allotments.

Sandy Lane – blocked drain causing pooling.

Draycot – drain blocked under road, so water running on surface.

A418 – water running down road on village side of Albury Lane.

Albury Lane – drainage.

Clerk to write to write separately regarding each item to County Highways regarding these matters.

Mrs Purse said that she is getting Gordon Hunt out to look at the problems.

c. Hedges on London Road, Milton Common – Mrs Purse said that the County Council insists that its assessment of the situation regarding the hedges is accurate.
